# Dear Friends,

As we enter week number "who knows?" of the pandemic and being confined to our homes, except for essential travel and business, many of us cannot say what month or day it is. It is trying – for some, it is boring. It is trying our patience. And for some, it will

- for some, it is boring. It is trying our patience. And for some, it will be scary for many months, even after businesses reopen and we are allowed to go out and about.

With that said, I read an article recently that helped to put some perspective into these times – and give us some points on which to focus. Harriet Connor, in *The Way* We Shape These Days is Shaping Us, writes, "Humans cannot live without rhythm any more than we can live without meaning. This goes right back to the creation of the world. God created in a rhythmical way: he made the world in six days – each with evening and morning – and rested on the seventh. God also built into creation the marking of time...

It wasn't just these natural rhythms that shaped the life of God's ancient people. God commanded the Israelites to order their lives to the beat of six plus one – God's own rhythm of creation. Each week comprised six days of work,

then a Sabbath of rest. Likewise, the land was to be worked for six years, then have a year of rest. After seven Sabbath years, the Israelites were to celebrate the year of Jubilee. In addition to these Sabbath patterns, the Israelite calendar included six different feasts throughout the year...

The ancient practices of Israel and the Church were based on the assumption that the way we shape our time is actually forming and shaping us. That's because our habits and rhythms of life train our hearts to long for certain things and ideals. These things we strive toward gradually shape the people we become. These days of confinement present us with a unique opportunity to reassess our personal and domestic habits; to give structure to our formless days" (from Internet. https:// au.thegospelcoalition.org/article/ the-way-we-shape-these-days-isshaping-us/. 05/13/20).

Connor then gives some suggestions that might help us shape our time in a way that helps us to grow in Christ. Here are a few of them:

Start with Sundays –
Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy. Make Sundays count.

Prayer – Cover the day in prayer: in the morning, throughout the day, before you go to bed.

Mealtimes – Gather around the table with family and friends – or use Zoom or the phone to do so

Put down the phone – Limit screen time. Read a book. Do a puzzle. Go for a walk. Send a note. Give Color to weekdays – Make the most of every day – plan special times Keep Special Things Scarce – Reserve special things for special times Notice Nature – Pay attention to God's creation around us

If we start these now, chances are when things get back to "normal," we will continue them. And how great will that be!


